


Whose Literacy is it Anyway?








What's Literacy?




The "Autonomous Model"

- "independent of social context, [literacy is] an autonomous variable whose consequences for society and cognition can be derived from its intrinsic character"
- Almost a stand in for "IQ" (this is still how a lot of people talk about it)



The "Ideological Model"

- "More than the acquisition of a writing technology or a suite of cognitive skills universal to all "literate" people, learning any literacy involves being socialized to contextualized practices with social, political, and ideological significance which varies across places, times, media, and genres — all laden with value judgments."


Literacy: More Specific Than "Critical Thinking"

- Historical literacy vs. "Knowing" history
- Literacy all the things:
 - Information, textual, cinematic,
 visual, news, mathematical, media,
 ludic, science, medicine, technology,
 cultural, etc. etc.



Educational Literacy

- Get's into "boring admin and governance stuff
- Most educators have very little educational literacy
- Not saying we're bad pedagogues

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Corporate Performance Reviews (PR) as Scholarship?

- Many issues with the way the value of education is measured, let alone how one shots are studied...
 - Science/social science envy
 - What variables can you even control for as a guest lecturer with few resources?
 - Four stars syndrome and the misuse of metrics by admin and faculty alike
 - Even by a lot of our own internal metrics they aren't great



Corporate Performance Reviews (PR) as Scholarship?


"the value of statistical significance was never downplayed in any of the 28 articles in which statistical significance was reported—it was only undermined when not in service of demonstrating positive (desirable) results. This 'having their cake and eating it too' rhetorical pattern can be explained, at least in part, by the pressure FOSLI investigators (usually academic librarians with instruction responsibilities) are under to demonstrate the value of library instruction, and, indirectly, their livelihoods."

Literacy: Navigating Information Landscapes


"English professor Margaret Torrell [...] argues, [...] that instructors are complicit in upholding information privilege because **students leave the course unable to contextualize academic and popular sources within the larger information landscape**. It is clear from the literature that university faculty agree that information literacy instruction from the library is important, but it rarely translates into meaningful library collaborations."

Honours Colleges: A Home for Better Library-lead Literacy Instruction?


• Pros:

- Courses open to students from all faculties as part of a "value added" program (no extra costs for students to be a part of it)
- Interdisciplinary and practical focus lends itself well to exploring the full scope of what literacy is and how to navigate information infrastructures and systems
- Librarians can teach interdisciplinary, full credit courses
 without (hopefully) stepping on the toes of other departments
- Literacy instruction actual has room to be relational and ongoing rather than "one-shot"



Honours Colleges: A Home for Better Library-lead Literacy Instruction?

- Con:
 - Small max enrolment size (60 to 100 students)
 - No structural support for this from the institution at the administration or library level (You *can* do it as a private individual. Everyone needs a hobby, I guess....)
 - Everyone is understaffed, precarious, and overwhelmed
- So... Probably not...
